

Contrary to the hopes and expectations of the many thousands of Refuseniks and the Soviet Jewish Prisoners of Conscience - nothing has chanced! On October 28th, we learned that Alexander is in the camp hospital suffering from a heart condition. His wife, Polina, has appealed to Andropov and to the camp authorities asking for an exact diagnosis. She reports that she would like to send him a parcel of warm clothes and wants to visit him. Both her personal (3-day visit) and the communal meetings were cancelled. She has not received mail from him for two months and is desperate for word from him, and is asking the camp commandant to allow letters in and our of the camp.
