In the very short time available it has not been possible to consult the Secretary of State in Madrid. We do however have some suggestions: para 2: "recognition of Israel" should read "relations with Israel". para 4, second tiret: this could be misinterpreted as a move away from HMG's consistent support for a global CW ban.

- we suggest that it should be amended to read "....until the establishment of a conventional balance and the global elimination of chemical weapons".
- para 5: President Reagan's recent speech (in Colorado) contains a passage which contradicts our view of the importance of nuclear deterrence. We suggest that the paragraph should simply begin "as regards SDI, I continue"
