PRIME MINISTER VISIT TO TURKEY I have amended the two speeches to take account of your comments and am anxious to get them off for translation. I have shown the texts again to the Foreign Secretary. He remains anxious on one point only and that is the reference to Turkey's application for EC membership, where he feels we must not mislead the Turks into expecting a greater degree of support than we shall in fact give.
