## PRESIDENT GORBACHEV'S VISIT

The programme for the visit of President and Mrs. Gorbachev is now almost in final shape. There are one or two points which I bring to your attention.

On the Tuesday afternoon you and Mr. Thatcher will go with President and Mrs. Gorbachev to Westminster Abbey to lay a wreath at the Grave of the Unknown Warrior. The choir of the Abbey will sing Benjamin Britten's Ceremony of Carols during the visit. The Gorbachevs will then go on to St. Paul's. There will be about 100 children outside from Sir John Cass's School in the City to welcome them. Inside the Cathedral, the choir will sing more Christmas carols.

After that the Gorbachevs will go on to visit a company called Sortex in Pudding Mill Lane. Sortex is a high technology company who have been exporting to the Soviet Union for a number of years and want to expand their business. They are part of the Bookers Group. The Russians are keen on this visit which they see as a drop-in event to meet workmen in a typical working environment (don't let's delude them!)

At the moment the Russians are still saying that Mr. Gorbachev is unable to attend a further talk with you on the Wednesday morning because of pressing business which will keep him at the Embassy until it's time to leave for the Palace. But the Soviet Ambassador has told me that he thinks this could change when Mr. Gorbachev actually gets here: he may after all want to have a talk with you. We had better keep that morning open.

Finally there is the question whether Mr. Thatcher should accompany Mrs. Gorbachev from the Palace to Heathrow (you will be accompanying President Gorbachev). Mr. Thatcher will not

be at the Palace lunch and would therefore have to go down to the Palace shortly before 1 pm to wait. I would not myself think this strictly necessary but you will want to decide.

The Soviet Embassy confirmed yesterday that the attached draft programme for the visits next week of President Gorbachev, Mrs Gorbacheva, Mr Shevardnadze, Mr Yakovlev and Mr Kamentsev had been approved by Moscow. The text has now gone to the printers to be produced in both Russian and English.

We have arranged in accordance with the Prime Minister's and the Secretary of State for Education's suggestions that there should be choirs singing carols at both Westminster Abbey and at St Pauls Cathedral. At St Pauls Cathedral there will be a group of 100 children from St John Cass's school in the City waiting outside to welcome the General Secretary and Mrs Gorbacheva.

After viewing a considerable number of possible options for the sightseeing tour, the Soviet Embassy opted to confine it to a visit to St Pauls followed by a drive along the All parallel to Docklands in order to visit a typical small modern British factory, where the General Secretary could meet the workers. The General Secretary wishes to get an idea for himself of the working conditions and working practices in a British factory. This visit is not therefore being described as a formal visit to the company for its own sake but as an impromptu call by the General Secretary on a typical British working environment. In fact the company chosen, Sortex, is particularly appropriate as they produce a high-technology product for the electronic sorting of such products as rice, diamonds and peas. The company estimate that large numbers of such machines are required if the Soviet food processing industry is to be capable of improving its product to a point where it would be fit for producing high quality baby foods and for export. They are currently testing some Russian rice with a view to supplying their machines to the Soviet rice industry. They have already exported some of their machines on a limited scale in recent years. Sortex is part of the large industrial group Booker. The company has 200 employees on site and the product is both researched, developed and manufactured all in this one factory. 90% of their products are exported and the turnover

is 12 million a year. It is therefore a good example for the General Secretary who is particularly interested in the problems of introducing the results of scientific research into the industrial production and is therefore likely to be very interested in seeing the on-site integration between the scientific research effort and the product development.

It is planned to finalise the detailed annotated programmes by close of play tomorrow and to organise rehearsals for the car convoys over the weekend.

One point on which it would be helpful to have advice concerns the Prime Minister's interpreter, Mr Pollock. We assume that the Prime Minister will wish Mr Pollock to be in attendance at the airport. Unfortunately there will be no room for Mr pollock in the Gorbachevs "Zil" car from the airport, so we hope that the Prime Minister will be content to rely on the Soviet interpreter. We will arrange for Mr Pollock to travel in one of the immediately following cars. The same arrangement would apply for the departure. We assume that the Prime Minister will also want Mr Pollock to interpret for her at the Palace.

PRESIDENT GORBACHEV'S VISIT

... 1. We have just held what we hope will be a final meeting with the Soviets and agreed with them "final programmes" for the visits next week of President Gorbachev, Mrs Gorbacheva, Mr Shevardnadze, Mr Yakovlev and Mr Kamentsev. I attach a copy. There will also be a version in Russian.

2. The Soviets have agreed that the visit to the company Sortex is to remain in the sightseeing programme. This visit is being portrayed as a drop-in type event to meet workmen in a typical working environment. In fact this is a rather appropriate visit as Sortex is a high technology company who have been exporting to the Soviet Union for a number of years on a limited scale. They are hoping to expand this business. In addition, Sortex is part of the large industrial group Bookers, whose Chairman will attend the Mansion House reception on 13 December.

3. In response to the Prime Minister's and the Education Secretary's suggestions about arranging for lots of children to be about at the places President and Mrs Gorbachev visit during their sightseeing afternoon on 13 December, the choir will sing Benjamin Brittain's Ceremony of Carols "Wolcum Yole" during their visit to Westminster Abbey. At St Paul's Cathedral there will be about 100 children outside from Sir John Cass's school in the City to welcome President and Mrs Gorbachev. Inside the Cathedral the choir will sing more Christmas carols.

... 4. I would be grateful if the PS could pass this information onto No 10 (spare copy of the programme attached) and I will follow up with a letter in the course of tomorrow.
